


In November 2012, I started taking photographs of musicians in Istanbul, and continued until August 2014. Why? It's a big subject, but mainly I was looking for a colourful specialty to focus on, musicians are generally out to be seen and photographed and so good subjects, and I have a catholic love for music and musicians so I could look for those special moments to catch. In August 2014 I moved to Montreal.

Usually my subjects were busking in the Metro stations or on Istiklal Caddesi, but many of them were very talented and did not consider themselves street musicians, rather they were taking the opportunity to earn some money to augment their other efforts.

In all, I photographed over 220 musicians and groups, some many times over the two years. Of those, I've mostly picked out the ones I got to know well and to appreciate their music as well as their photogeneity. Some of them have made properly produced commercial CDs and have travelled widely to festivals, concerts and other performances, some just play in the same place on the street in Istanbul. Several have appeared on television, either as the focus of a show or as part of a show, and at least one has appeared in a movie, albeit briefly. Most have been videoed by tourists and can be found on You-Tube, some many times.

The music that they perform includes classical, improvisational, Iranian, traditional jazz, modern jazz, traditional Turkish music, various kinds of popular music and modern Turkish music. The instrumentation varies from cellos, violins, trumpet, guitar, saxophone to Turkish bendirs, darbukas, Iranian santurs, tars, and many other new and old instruments from time to time. On Istanbul's Istiklal Caddesi, on a good day with lots of visitors, there may be 15 individual or groups of buskers playing from one to several hours, and changing with others throughout the day. Peak times are afternoon and evening in the balmy winter and late afternoon to evening on hot days in the summer.
