Our MCC Cameragram is being revamped. The Executive approved a change to the number of annual Cameragram issues. Starting in the 2016-2017 season, we will be producing two (2) per year. You will receive a printed copy of a "full-year" issue (September 2016-May 2017) at the beginning of the season and a digital version for "year-end" (Summer) in June. e President's Veport

This past year we have introduced many changes at the Club, all for the better. We have a strong Executive who are determined to bring you the best experience possible for each and every Monday night. We are united in our goals and filled with energy and commitment.

Last summer, Ann Pearson held 3 judging workshops which helped to further educate and prepare members for their task as judges. She hopes to hold more workshops this summer.

This year, our Nature images were outstanding, earning members more HMs than in our Pictorial and Print categories. This excellence was reflected at the SPPQ Gala (the annual competition from 36 photo clubs in the province of Quebec) when Sylvia Rourke's image won first place in the Nature category. The high score also saw her image achieve second place in the 719 images submitted in all four categories of this competition. Congratulations, Sylvia Rourke!

We would like to improve the quality of images submitted in our Pictorial division next year and this is where we will focus our attention.

Our Print division has been revamped and it is thriving. Now, during the first half of the evening, the judging is now being done in a second room while education tutorials or member presentations are conducted in the main hall. This has improved the presentation of the competition and we are working on streamlining it.

Changes for next year are as follows

— submission from 4 regular prints to 3 regular;

— submission from 3 Theme prints to 2 Theme prints.



This will allow for increased member participation and pre-judging challenges.

The board has approved the decision to have only two Cameragrams per year. There will be a full-year edition covering our program from September to May, mailed to your home approximately two weeks before the opening of the new season. The second Cameragram with Year End reports and results will be in digital format only. Both Cameragrams will be available on our website.

Phillip Shapiro provided many new and different outing opportunities. Well done, Phillip, for the energy and creativity devoted to this important Club activity.

Special Mentions

I would like to pay our respects to a fellow competitor who just recently passed away. Juan Duik will be missed by all who knew him and admired his excellent creative compositions.

Also, although less known to our present membership, we owe a debt of gratitude to one of our oldest Club members, Frank Hopkins, a member for close to 75 years who passed away last November. The MCC was quite



important to him and as an indication of his commitment, he generously bequeathed us \$25,000. We sincerely appreciate this gift and we are using some of this money by upgrading our audio-visual equipment in order to provide a better quality of service to our members.

By now you are all familiar with our new projector and the huge improvement in the quality of our projected images. Some of you may also have noticed that our audio speakers are now mounted on the sidewalls of the hall. This provides better sound, eliminates noisy feedback and significantly lessens the amount of work in setting up for each Monday night's meeting.

A new and larger motorized screen will be installed that can be lowered over the stage with the use of a remote control. This 4k screen will further improve the sharpness of the projected image and provide a proper white for good colour. More improvements will follow during the summer.

We will also replace our laptop computer to be able to supply 4k images to the projector. In addition, a new 4k TV monitor will be purchased for judging.

In the upcoming season, members will be able to submit images with a much higher resolution. Instead of limiting your image to 1400 x 1050 pixels (about 1 Mb), you will now be able to submit your photos at a resolution of 3840 x 2160 pixels (which is approximately 4k and around 4 Mb), greatly improving the quality of your images. The aspect ratio will increase from 4:3 to 16:9. Further explanation and information about all of this will be sent out to you by email.

Before announcing the changes in our Executive, I would like to explain some structural changes we have made. Because our world of communications is changing into more and more of a digital mode, we felt that MCC should streamline its communication and be able to reach out to more nonmembers by using social media such as Facebook and Twitter. As a result, we have established a new Executive position called Communications Chair. This person will be responsible for overseeing a committee of members who will produce our Cameragram, fulfill the functions of a webmaster and design and post information on social media and other platforms.

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2015-2016 Year-End Review Guest and Club Presenters & Members' Creativity Nights

It has become a tradition now that my report is a visual presentation rather than just a textual report. With the help of Sylvia Rourke who prepared the visual files for me, here is the year-end review of presentations at the Montreal Camera Club, with a portrait of each presenter and samples of the work presented.





01 - Oct 05, Michelle Valberg, our 3rd Bonnie Nichol Lecturer, was an outstanding presenter with her stunning images of the Arctic and her tales of working with the youth of First Nations people in the Canadian North. It was truly an *Evening of Travel and Adventure Photography.*





02 - Oct. 26, Christoph Fischer, shared his passion for the natural world with images from Namibia and Canada's Yukon Territory called *Beauty Surrounds You*. Like Valberg, he wants his work to not only inspire people, but to have social consequences. He hopes to motivate viewers to work for the preservation of our Canadian wilderness regions through his intitiative called SOUL— SAVE OUR LANDS.





03 - Nov. 02, Our first member presentation was by Jaroslava Miler who took us along on her *Travels to Columbia*. Although she was somewhat apprehensive before her trip about the safety of this destination, her images of both its cities and the countryside well illustrated that Columbia is a both a safe and beautiful place to visit.







04 - Nov. 16, Eric Constantineau from Photo Service reviewed basic camera technology in preparation for the tips he provided on how to succeed with our *Night and Long Exposure Photography*.

05 - Nov. 23, Interpretive Image Night is an ever popular theme night at the Club so we are sharing the many "interpretations" of an image provided by Cindy Canavan of London's Tower Bridge taken on her trip last summer. There were many crowd pleasers, and the appearance of Prince George in Michael Consiglio's image with a reference to his great-grandmother got a big laugh.





06 - Dec. 07, Ann Pearson donned her other MCC hat as an Educator, to give an illustrated lecture on the history of *Creative Photography*. From the early days in the mid-1800s, photographers found ways to manipulate their images to extend what a photograph could express—beyond its documentary capabilities.







07 - Dec. 14, during the Holiday Party, the members of Momenta Photography, a group formed from students of Peter Ferst at the Visual Arts Centre, presented their images and spoke of their collaboration in preparing exhibitions. The group donates profits from the sale of their images to a Montreal charity.



08 - Jan. 25, our first winter/spring guest speaker, Linda Rutenberg, shared the evolution of her 30-year career as a Fine Art photographer in a show titled, *The Inquisitive Eye.* We journeyed with her from her beginnings in the documentary tradition through her famous books on *The Garden at Night*, featuring images from many world renowned gardens. Her recent book, *The Gaspé Peninsula: Land on the Edge of Time*, photographing with the bright light of winter on the Gaspé Peninsula, has been equally successful.





09 - Feb. 22, the ever popular Bernard Brault shared another aspect of his photographic career with us, his travel photography, including some images taken with the new mirrorless Nikon 3 camera. Not to disappoint us, he ended the evening with examples of some of his favourite Olympic sports images.





10 - Feb. 29, We thought you would enjoy a second look at the submissions for our second popular theme night, *Create a Poster*.





11 - Mar. 07, our second member presenter was the lively Street Photography work of Peter Graham on *Istanbul Street Musicians*. Not content with just snapping pictures, Peter shared stories about the people in his images, some of whom have become lasting friends.



12 - Mar. 21, MCC member Steve Troletti gave us a tutorial on *Cross Polarization*, what it is, how to do it, and the amazing images he has taken using this technology. The necessary polarizing filters are both affordable and easily available.





13 - April 11, MCC member Phillip Shapiro gave us a tutorial on *Stacking Images*. With the use of a free shareware program called Image Stacker, he demonstrated how to use this method to photograph star trails and to improve the depth of field in images taken with macro lenses.



14 - May 09, our last member presenter, Danny Taran, treated us to a wonderful presentation entitled *Taran Adventures* which showcased shots from his many photographic expeditions, including Iceland and the Antarctic.


There were 633 images submitted this year, a small 3% increase over last year. Street submissions dropped from 22% last year to 18% this year but this was offset by the higher proportion of images received in the Creative and Pictorial categories. There were four Honourable Mentions awarded in an overall acceptance rate of 91%.

While Class A member submissions increased by 8%, there was the corresponding decrease in submissions from Class B members. This continues a trend noted in last year's statistics. Currently, 26% of images received are from Class B members.





We had an amazing season with our members showcasing their prints. It has been incredible to see the support that Print has received in the past year by the members competing as well as those watching from the audience. I believe that having a split evening is helping with this.



We had 4 Honorable mentions this year. Congratulations to everyone who won ribbons! I would like to share a note about one of our Print Competitors, Juan Duik, who recently passed away. He was an avid competitor in the Print, especially the Creative division. His composite visions will be missed.

HONOURS AWARDS 2015-2016

In 1954 the late Walter F. Wood ARPA, FPSA established a system of Honours Awards for the Montreal Camera Club.

The purpose of these awards is to reward members not only for photographic proficiency but also for their contribution to the Club on the Executive Committee and through other Club activities. As well, the awards are designed to encourage members to enter national and international photographic competitions and to become active on committees of national and international societies.

A member progresses from the initial Pictorialist award to the more difficult advanced stages in the system until he or she reaches the highest level, the Fellowship.

Over the years, the rules governing these Honours Awards have been modified to meet changing conditions, however the goals remain unchanged. To qualify for the top Honour Awards requires a high degree of photographic and service achievement at the Club as well as participation in photographic activities at the national and international level.







Juan Diuk 2016

Artist Juan Diuk was born in Uruguay and lived in Buenos Aires, Argentina and Montreal. He started an amateur photographic career in 1973 by earning several international prizes, mainly on the Photographic Society of

America circuit.

Juan won gold medals in international exhibits at Minneapolis-St. Paul, Minnesota; Anaheim, California; Denver, Colorado and Salt Lake City, Utah.

He became a judge, teacher, lecturer and an organizer of seminars and workshops on subjects such as photo techniques, Gestalt, virtual perception and color interpretation.

Juan studied drawing and painting with Hermenegildo Sabat, one of Argentina's greatest artists. From 1993 on, he started to investigate the use of photography in printing techniques, mainly screen painting.

He developed a vast collection of collages composed from prints, photos, and paintings. He had several solo and group exhibits in Buenos Aires and New York City.

Juan was a long-time member of the Montreal Camera Club, inspiring the members with his amazing creativity.
