The President's Report

Hard to believe that this marks the end of my second year as President—amazing how time flies. My main objective this past year was to improve the digital competitions by standardizing the judging process. With Cindy Canavan's help, the Club purchased a 42" monitor that was calibrated for hours by John Surridge and Cindy, then transported to all the offsite judging locations and then brought back to the Club where the same judges gave their comments. This provided a level playing field for all competitors. At the present time, the cost of improving our projector and replacing the screen is too high to justify. I believe as is, it serves its purpose for non-competitive presentations is a substantial benefit to our Print competitions, as well as an adequate aid in Nature and Pictorial competitions.

My objective in the next year is to help improve the quality of judging, specifically with the type of comments from our judges. As a start, during the summer, our Education Chair, Ann Pearson, will set up some evenings with judging exercises for small groups of no more than five or six members who would be interested in participating. In this way we hope to increase the pool of judges from our membership. Training exercises should be both enjoyable and helpful. We also will work on expanding the list of external judges.

If we succeed in achieving both of these goals, comments from the judges should greatly improve.



The next announcement has to do with our Cameragram. My report at the AGM detailed information about rising costs for printing and mailing which prompted the Executive to reluctantly approve an additional cost of \$5 to our membership fees. I am now pleased to announce that Sylvia and Cindy have found a new printing service which means that we will be able to continue distributing a printed version to members who wish to have a copy at NO additional cost.

Sylvia and her team will continue to produce the Cameragram in its usual fantastic quality. All 3 yearly editions will be available for you to download and view from our website in pdf format.

The printed Cameragram will no longer be mailed to you prior to the opening Fall season. Membership Renewal forms for season 2015-2016 will be emailed to you during the summer. If you want to be able to pick up your printed copy on Opening Night, you will need to renew and send your cheques well before August 21. Please send your renewal

form and your cheque directly to Sylvia as we do not want the church to handle our mail during the summer months.

Our website is managed by Rachel Bilodeau and she has done a fantastic job posting and maintaining all pertinent information on an almost daily basis.

Our Executive, of whom I am extremely proud, works tirelessly, all the time. These are your unsung heroes. The stage is set, the projector is ready and waiting, the competitions are prepared, images are judged off site for 10 of the 15 competitions. Guest speakers are contacted, welcomed and housed if necessary. Locations for outings are scouted in advance for safety, comfort, bathrooms and parking spaces. The SPPQ is contacted on a regular basis. Information of all types—competition results, schedules, images and general information—is posted both in the

Cameragram and on the website. Trophies are collected, cleaned and engraved. Club statistics are updated. Bills are paid, leases are negotiated, monies are collected and deposited, and minutes are written and distributed. Information is archived. Publicity is distributed. Food is purchased and our canteen is staffed and they serve you with a smile, all voluntarily. On many occasions at Executive meetings this year, I stood up and applauded the Executive for their stellar work. Never have I come across more helpful, willing and giving people than our Executive. Because of them we are a strong united club with common interests. "We are the Montreal Camera Club."

2014-2015 Guest Presenters – The Year in Review

Last year, my visual presentation rather than just a textual report proved to be a popular choice, so here is this year's review of the 2014-15 year at the Montreal Camera Club with a portrait of each presenter and samples of the work presented.



On Sept. 8, Fred Hore was our opening presenter. His show titled "REMARKABLE 1. "IMAGES: from Versailles to Dinan" brought us to some of the renowned treasures of France such as the Palace at Versailles, Château Fontainebleau and other castles and houses along the Loire River Valley. Over the years, this long-time friend has presented many of his travel adventures at our Club.





2. Guy Boily – gave the second Bonnie Nichol Lecture with a series of slideshows called "THE IMPORTANCE OF CREATIVITY." For Guy it's all about being prepared to do your best work on location and not to just fix up

your image with post-processing. Observation of a scene or subject matter, before even putting the camera to one's eye, helps to develop a unique and personal approach to one's photography.





3. Ann Pearson gave an illustrated lecture entitled "Two Visionary Photographers," Henri Cartier-Bresson was famous for capturing "the decisive moment" during his long career of photographing the human condition and

coverage of world events. The second part of the presentation explored the challenging imagery of Lynne Cohen, world-famous for her enigmatic and thought-provoking interiors.

4. Nov. 24 provided our members with a double bill of entertainment. Barbara Deans, with the help of John Surridge, presented award-winning images from the MCC Archives. "A LOOK BACK" was a selective retrospective of MCC's rich heritage.

The title of her presentation "A PASSIONATE EYE" well reflected her 20-year love affair with photography.





6. The first speaker for our Winter/Spring season was Patrick LaRoque on Jan. 19. His title said it all: "PROXIMITY: STORIES FROM THE INVISIBLE—A REFLECTION ON PHOTOGRAPHIC SUBJECTS AND VISUAL STORYTELLING." Patrick infuses his corporate photographs with the same narrative quality that he uses in his personal work.



7. In the second half of the Nature evening on Jan. 29, John Surridge, who has been running the slideshow competition for many years, made a presentation on "HOW TO CREATE A SLIDESHOW". Eight members took part this year.







8. On Feb. 23, Steve Troletti presented "From A to Z Photography." He devotes much of his photography to making people aware of our natural resources and the need to preserve them. One of his other specialties is as a location scout for television and film. You can follow Steve on his blog:

The first featured the images taken for THE CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL ORGAN COMPETITION (CIOC) by five of our members, George Liberman, John Zimmerman, Paul Eifert, Philippe Laporta and Alain Roy. Their images followed in the tradition of those created by Bonnie Nichol for many previous competitions.





10. On March 30, Diane Dupuis-Kallos presented a slideshow the on many charitable outreach projects undertaken by members of the Club under the title, "MCC and Friends Helping Others." Volunteers photograph and provide prints to those who would otherwise not have the opportunity to have these precious mementos for family and friends.

After the Annual General Meeting on May 4, our final presenter, Geoff McDade, showed many of his wonderful street images from Gauatemala and elsewhere in a slideshow entitled "STREETWALKING AT HOME AND ABROAD." 614 images were submitted this year, which was a drop of 11% over last year. This drop came from Class B, which only submitted 177 images vs. 266 last year. We hope we can reverse this trend next year.

There was very little change in the mix, with Pictorial representing 69% of the total images, 22% in Street and 9% in Creative.

Overall acceptance was a lot higher at 86% versus 68% last year.

After a successful year, as a returning Chair of the Nature Division, I would like to congratulate all of you for contributing superb work to our monthly competitions. In my opinion, the overall caliber of the entries in the Nature division was outstanding.

There was a total of 312 submissions with 280 acceptances. The acceptance rate was 89%, a bit higher than last year.

Along with the abundance of beautiful bird images and other zoological subjects, there was an increase in entries for the Botany and General categories, which is encouraging. On average, this works out to be 30% of our total entries.

I am looking forward to seeing you all next season. Keep up the great work and have a great summer, shooting!





We have had an increase in the number of members competing in each competition: an average of 14 this year from an average of 11 last year. The number of members competing in Class B was lower this year compared to last year due to the large number of competitors who had graduated to Class A. Two members returned to Print competition which is nice to see. There were 13 competitors in Class A (8 last year) and 5 in Class B (10 last year).

There were 278 entries this year, up from 250 last year. We are returning close to what we had in the 2012-2013 season. Apart from the Theme category, we've had the greatest number of prints entered since I've taken over as Chair of Print.

Finally, we had 8 Honourable Mentions this year. Congratulations to all those who won ribbons! Enjoy your summer, go out and take photos, and I hope to see you next year at the Print Competitions.





For 2014-2015, the Volunteer trophy is awarded to Barbara Deans and Kathryn Mason for their individual services to supporting and administering the Club over a significant period of years.

Barbara Deans has been a member of the Montreal Camera Club since 1961. As well as being a multiple trophy winner, she has worked continuously in providing and hosting educational seminars and workshops for members. She was the CAPA representative for many years when the Club actively participated in CAPA competitions. She has been President at least twice and for the last two years has worked to publicize the Montreal Camera Club in the local media. She has continued to provide the Executive with guidance as a Past-President.

Kathryn Mason has been a Club member since 1974. As well as being a multiple trophy winner, particularly in Nature, she has presented her work on numerous occasions to the members' benefit. She has been President at least three times over her period of membership as well as holding many other posts. She is presently Treasurer, and Judging and Standards Chair. Kathryn, a lawyer by profession, has provided valuable guidance to the Club over many years. She has generously and regularly hosted the Club at her home in the country for spring and autumn outings.

It is through the efforts of our members exemplified by Barbara and Kathryn that the Club has survived and prospered over its long existence. We look to all our members to help maintain the tradition of mutual support that makes the Montreal Camera Club successful.

HONOURS AWARDS 2014-2015

In 1954 the late Walter F. Wood ARPA, FPSA established a system of Honours Awards for the Montreal Camera Club.

The purpose of these awards is to reward members not only for photographic proficiency but also for their contribution to the Club on the Executive Committee and through other Club activities. As well, the awards are designed to encourage members to enter national and international photographic competitions and to become active on committees of national and international societies.

A member progresses from the initial Pictorialist award to the more difficult advanced stages in the system until he or she reaches the highest level, the Fellowship.

Over the years the rules governing these Honours Awards have been modified to meet changing conditions, however the goals remain unchanged. To qualify for the top Honour Awards requires a high degree of photographic and service achievement at the Club as well as participation in photographic activities at the national and international level.




SPPQ DEFI INTERCLUBS

These are the top six out of 35 clubs from across the province. Below are the 20 images entered by MCC, and their results are listed on the right.








