At the end of our 2018-2019 season our membership stands at 179. We have an excellent program of lectures, terrific outings which are very well-attended, and more competitions than most



#### 2018-2019 Year-End Review

As Program Chair, I like to illustrate my year-end report on-screen at the Annual General Meeting as a visual reminder of all the presenters and program related activities that have enriched our club in the past year.

This presentation of the Montreal Camera Club 2018-2019 program is only made possible with the help of Sylvia Rourke, who provided the visuals from the Club archives.

I want to thank those members who have sent in suggestions to Lorraine Deslauriers and myself for next year's programming.

Sept. 17-RON LEVINE was our first presenter with his award-winning documentary series "PRISONERS OF AGE" about elderly inmates in prison systems. He has been working on this project for 20 years, bringing public attention to the miscarriage of justice in a system which can keep some men & women incarcerated for years for relatively minor offences. Although Ron is a Montrealer, he does a lot of his commercial work in the USA. He also likes to photograph everyday life in the rural southern states. You can tell from his images that he establishes a good rapport with the people he photographs.

Oct. 15-SUPREET SAHOO's "TROPICAL NATURE PHOTOGRAPHY" introduced us to some birds and animals in Central and South America previously not seen at the Club. He reminded us that these countries are a paradise for bird photographers, having one of the world's largest concentration in both numbers and variety. Supreet stressed the importance of researching the species you want to photograph, working with the local population for habitat tips, and choosing quality over quantity.



## Nov. 5-CHRIS HARRIS's "A PHOTOGRAPHER'S JOURNEY" was our 6th Bonnie Nichol Lecture Series



speaker. We were very fortunate to be able to enjoy Chris and his wife Rita's excellent presentation on the Chilcotin area of British Columbia, thanks to the subsidy Chris received as an ambassador for British Columbia tourism. He calls himself "a professional freelance narrative photographer." The



purpose of his photography is to make people more aware of the beauty of nature and to hold in reverence its essential biodiversity as necessary for our very survival on this planet. Chris is a second-generation photographer – his father Chic Harris was an active, respected member of the MCC in the 60s and 70s.

## CHRIS HARRIS "DISCOVER YOUR INNER ARTIST" WORKSHOP

Ten MCC members profited from this inspiring two-day workshop, working with "in-camera" multiple exposures and camera movement. We explored the artistry of a more abstract or impressionistic interpretation of even the most banal subject matter.



Lorraine Deslauriers created a book of workshop images which is a great souvenir of our days with Chris.

The good news is that Chris and Rita will be spending the month of October in Montreal and members might have another chance to work with him.

Nov. 26 – LOUISE ABBOTT
"THE GENTLE WITNESS: MY
LIFE AS A DOCUMENTARY
PHOTOGRAPHER." While some
people explore far off countries, for
nearly forty years Louise has been
documenting rural communities in
Eastern Canada and, in the past
decade, indigenous Cree communities.



She is concerned with the social and environmental changes which are affecting them. Louise, like Chris Harris, produces her own books and videos on her subject matter. She still very much believes that documentary work has the power to both inform and motivate people to action.

#### Jan. 7-MARK LACHOVSKY

"BENEATH THE WAVES" underwater photography dazzled us with the variety and beauty to be found in the ocean depths. He shared tips about how to handle the challenges of underwater



photography while scuba diving.

#### Jan. 28-SUE VO HO

"CITY MEMORIES" presented us with her multilayered photographs. Her images are a creative exploration of her inner reality in response to her onlocation photographs captured with both film and digital cameras. Her process needs a lot of visualization in order to create her complex images.

presentation, combining history and

Marlene, our CAPA Liaison, provided us with important and timely information concerning CAPA competitions, coordinated the selection of club image submissions, and encouraged us all to participate. Her dedicated work has shepherded us into the winner's circle many times this year. Thank you, Marlene!

#### Oct. 29-PETER GRAHAM

Peter's "TWO PASSIONS" presentation shared his unique architectural images, а kind surrealistic approach to documenting interiors of mosques and churches. In addition. we enjoyed images from his current preoccupation with photographing on-stage or street performers and musicians.



Dec. 3-LORRAINE DESLAURIERS "ZEN AND CONTEMPLATIVE PHOTOGRAPHY" Our members very much appreciated learning about this technique of slowing down, and allowing oneself to really connect with the environment around us. Using this meditative approach to live in the



present moment we see differently, not only with our eyes but also by incorporating our emotions and thoughts into our photography.

#### Apr. 1-ANN PEARSON

"f.64 PHOTOGRAPHY GROUP" Ann concentrated her lecture on three of the most important members of this breakthrough group's approach to photography as art in the west of the United States in the 1930s. Their aesthetic continues to influence contemporary photography. The



breadth and depth of Ansel Adams' landscape photography helped motivate the US government to create the Nation Park system. Adams also helped to set up the world renowned Photography Collection at the Museum of Modern Art in New York City. Edward Weston's poetic approach opened our eyes to the sensuous beauty around us, whether it be with a bell pepper, the rocks and sand of the California coastline, or the human body. Imogen Cunningham was famous for her portraits of well-known artists such as Freda Kahlo, and for her almost abstract close-ups of plants and flowers.



## May 6-GUY LARIN "TRAVEL PHOTOGRAPHY: THE IMPORTANCE OF PREPARATION"

We enjoyed Guy's award-winning images as he shared his approach to being ready to capture wow factor images while travelling.

The biggest challenge for me this year has been working without a Co-Chair and having to manage and tabulate the entries for judging night on my own. I thank Brian for providing me with assistance in the first Pictorial competition of the year, and for managing the 4th when I had to leave on an urgent family matter.

The second big challenge was to find qualified judges to judge our Pictorial competitions. This has driven me to work more and more with outside judges. and I believe we have found now a group of qualified external judges that I hope I can depend on for next year.

We have maintained strong numbers in the Pictorial Competitions. We had a total of 778 entries, down 6%

compared to last year. There were 482 entries submitted by Class A members compared to 485 from the previous year and 296 entries submitted by Class B member compared to 342 from the previous year.

We had 54% more entries in the Creative division and a 13.5% drop in entries in Street. Pictorial remained the same with 482 entries this year compared to 485 entries last year. We had a record number of promotions from Class B to Class A with a total of 10 members moving up.

I look forward to seeing your entries in next year's Pictorial competitions. Wishing you all a wonderful summer and don't stop taking pictures for your inventory.

This has been a very successful year for the nature competitions and I would like to congratulate all of the contributors. The quality of the images has been magnificent. This is my first year as Nature Chair as I assumed the duties from Ilana Block. I would like to greatly thank Ilana for easing the transition. I would also like to thank Brian McPhee for being there for me when I requested assistance.

This year a total of 489 images were submitted with 463 images accepted for an acceptance rate of 95%, which is up from previous years.

By category, Botany received 38 images, General 101 images, Ornithology 165 images, and Zoology 185 images.

Special thanks to the judges for volunteering their time and expertise.

Many thanks to the members who competed in this division. We encourage all members, both long-time and new, to submit images in our next competitions.

Enjoy the summer. Keep up the excellent work. Contribute your best images to the competitions after the summer.

It has been an honour to be your Nature Chair and I look forward to seeing you in the next season.

Commencing with the next season, MCC Nature will follow CAPA rules (except that in Ornithology MCC will accept pelicans on pilings, and barn owls in barns), and going forward we will review and consider any changes to CAPA rules.

There was a total of 315 prints submitted this year compared to 328 from last year. Two prints were disqualified but the affected members were able to resubmit new prints.

Twenty-seven members competed during the season (fifteen in Class A, twelve in Class B) which is slightly down from last year's twenty-nine. Seven new members chose to compete in Print. I hope to see past members return to Print to show us their amazing photos.

Overall, the number of prints increased this year:

Colour: TOTAL = 146 vs. last year 169 Monochrome: TOTAL = 98 vs. last year 99 Creative: TOTAL = 47 vs. last year 33 Theme: TOTAL = 26 vs. last year 31

Only six prints were not awarded an acceptance, therefore the acceptance rate was 98.0%. The average mark was 78.8%. We had nine Honorable Mentions this year, and there were three ties with thirty winners.

The Annual General Meeting held in May brought to a close another year of weekly meetings, lectures, socializing, and competitions. While we are all enjoying a summer of outings, the Executive Committee is also hard at work on a number of projects.

- MCC Website has a new look thanks to our Webmaster, Rachel.
- New member log-in procedure is being finalized, and you will be able to create
  your own password, using your own email address to access the MEMBERS
  tab. The access to the MEMBERS tab is valid for paid-up members during the
  MCC year, i.e. September 1 to August 31. An email invitation containing a link to
  the password creation page will be sent out shortly.
- The Nature, Pictorial and Print competitions are being revised abd their guidelines are being updated.
  - Nature and all its categories will follow the current CAPA rules and standards, with the one exception that MCC will continue to accept pelicans on pilings and the Barn Owl.
  - Pictorial Street Photography category will be changed to Photojournalism and subject to the current CAPA rules and standards.
  - Pictorial Themes will form part of the General Category (formerly Pictorial section) for competitions #2 and #4.
  - Pictorial Creative category has been renamed to Altered Reality with new guidelines.
  - Print Creative category has been renamed to Altered Reality with new quidelines
  - Print The Theme Category is being reevaluated.
- The File naming conventions are being revised in a way that will track the number of entries submitted in each category.
- We have enrolled in G-Suite, which allows us to use our domain name, changed from @gmail.com to @montrealcameraclub.com. A notification was sent out recently.
- For 2019-20 Season we are coming age, you will have the option to renew your membership dues online on our website as well at the club. We will be adding Square in the fall for membership renewals at the Club meetings. You will be advised of the new procedures.
- We are in the process of exploring the possibility of online judging for our club.
- This winter a series of Judging Tutorial Sessions were held after the MCC hosted a CAPA Judging Training day in November 2018. We are now making a concerted effort to improve the judging at our in-house competitions. A huge thank you goes to Ann Pearson, Florence Jean, and Cindy Canavan who kindly hosted these evenings.
- We are planning to have several training sessions using external, experienced
  judges to guide us in specific areas, e.g. Ornithology in Nature. Improvement
  comes with practice, and we hope that the membership will continue to evaluate
  our progress with the understanding that we will need time and encouragement
  to get better at this difficult job.



As well, the awards are designed to encourage members to enter national and international photographic competitions and to become active on committees of national and international societies.

A member progresses from the initial Pictorialist award to the more difficult advanced stages in the system until he or she reaches the highest level, the Fellowship.

Over the years, the rules governing these Honours Awards have been modified to meet changing conditions, however the goals remain unchanged. To qualify for the top Honour Awards requires a high degree of photographic and service achievement at the Club as well as participation in photographic activities at the national and international level.

Our members seem very enthusiastic and willing to help in submitting images as well as participating in selecting images for the various competitions.

In October, I presented the new CAPA competitions and gave examples of how there were many surprises each month. Surprisingly, many more MCC members have joined as individual members and have been doing very well, thus giving our club a high profile across Canada. This year, I have sent requests for images so we have relied on submissions as well as our archives.
